NN8640-4978 (GHT-GISS) Study

Does your child have idiopathic short stature (ISS)?

Consider enrolling your child in a clinical research study

The NN8640-4978 (GHT-GISS) Study aims to learn more about children and teenagers with ISS who have received growth hormone (GH) therapy. The study is also looking at how well growth medicine works in different children.

We plan to enroll a wide variety of participants because ISS may affect people differently based on their age, sex, gender, and race/ethnicity.

Your child may be able to take part if they:

- have an ISS diagnosis
- received at least 1 year of GH therapy before they reached puberty
- were the following age at the start of their GH therapy:
 - boys: at least 3 years, and not older than 11 years of age
 - girls: at least 3 years, and not older than 10 years of age.

The study will require only 1 visit to the study center. You will receive \$25 compensation for extra time spent at the study center.

This study has been reviewed by an Institutional Review Board (IRB)/ Ethics Committee (EC), which protects the rights, safety, and wellbeing of the participants.
